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GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN TECHNICAL WRITING

The Graduate Certificate in Technical Writing is a program designed to give students who already hold a B.A. or a B.S. the opportunity to enroll in courses to earn a graduate certificate. The certificate will aid those already enrolled in graduate programs who wish to have more training in the theory and practice of writing in the workplace.

This certificate program requires 15 hours of credit. Students may transfer up to 3 hours of credit from another program to apply to the Graduate Certificate in Technical Writing. Admission to the certificate program requires a formal application through the Office of Graduate Admissions.
