CERTIFICATE IN PUBLIC HISTORY

The Department of History offers a Certificate in Public History to both degree seeking students as well as non-degree seeking individuals seeking professional advancement. The Certificate in Public History introduces undergraduate students to the field of public history while helping students to develop skills necessary to convey history to audiences in a wide array of public and private settings outside of academia. Students have the opportunity to complete a variety of projects, including website design and content development, exhibit design and narrative development, developing history education programs and interpretive programs for museums, National Register of Historic Places nominations, and cultural landscape analyses and reports. Through the internship requirement, students will gain valuable public history experience while working in a professional setting. The certificate will help prepare students for graduate level work in public history. The certificate is comprised of eighteen hours of coursework and a required three hour internship.

The Certificate in Public History may be competed online if arrangements are made for HI 496 (Public History Internship) to be completed at an appropriate venue in the student's location.
